| Standard<br>Surgical<br>Masks | <ul> <li>Standard Ear-loop or Surgical Masks:</li> <li>Ensure patients with acute respiratory illness are separated from other patients in waiting areas and are offered surgical masks, tissues, and hand hygiene degermer</li> <li>All patient care staff should follow Droplet Precaution protective measures (surgical mask, eye protection, gown, and gloves) when coming within 3 feet of a patient with respiratory illness</li> </ul>                              |  | <ul> <li>Environmental Cleaning:</li> <li>Disinfect Surfaces – Wipe equipment<br/>and surfaces frequently with Asepti<br/>wipes to prevent contamination with<br/>respiratory secretions</li> <li>Use hospital approved disinfectant for<br/>routine cleaning, pay attention to high<br/>touch surfaces</li> <li>Refer to EVS/IC policy</li> </ul>   |
